MAP 21 OPPORTUNITIES FOR LOCALS

• TANSPORTAION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM— \$814 M PER YEAR

CONSOLIDATES THE OLD REC TRAILS/SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS AND TRANPORTATION ENHANCEMENTS PROGRAMS

MAP21 OPPORTUNITIES FOR LOCALS

- HIGHWAY SAFTEY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM
- Dollars are doubled
- Project eligibility broadened
- Locals must be considered in new shsp's
- HRRR program eliminated but states must show a reduction in rural fatality rate
- Great focus on data: from showing performance overall to setting investment priorities; e.g. for high risk rural roads



MAP 21 opportunities for locals

- Asset management plans-very prescriptive on the expanded NHS (plans for meeting targets;
 LCCA and Risk management analyses; etc.)
- RD&T and LTAP/TTAP funding; EXPANDED PRESSURE ON LIMITED DOLLARS WITH NEW PROVISIONS FOR THE CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE AND EDC AND FHWA'S SHARE OF SHRP 2 COMPETING WITH LTAP AND TTAP, ETC. (FHWA DOES HAVE A LOT OF FLEXIBILITY)

Map 21 -Opportunities for Locals

 Bridge program--eliminates discreet allocation of on- system and off -system bridge dollars but requires the states to set-aside a portion of their STP program for bridges off the federal aid highways .The Sec . to set min NHS perf. targets and sanctions for failing to meet—program dollars redirected
